 Charter of
 Westhampton Free Library

Whereas a petition for incorporation as an institution of the University has been duly received, and
 Whereas official inspection shows that suitable provision has been made for buildings, furniture,
 equipment and for proper maintenance, and that all other prescribed requirements have been fully met
 Therefore, being satisfied that public interests will be promoted by such incorporation, the Regents by
 virtue of the authority conferred on them by law hereby incorporate with permanent charter the present
 trustees of the corporation created as Westhampton Free Library Association by the provisional charter
 granted by the Regents March 1, 1897

and their ^{associates and} successors in office under the corporate name of Westhampton Free Library
 with all powers, privileges and duties, and subject to all limitations and restrictions prescribed for such
 corporations by law or by the ordinances of the University of the State of New York. The first trustees
 of said corporation shall be the incorporators above named. The number of trustees shall be five
 and their successors shall be elected by the members of the corporation, one each year to serve
 five years

This corporation shall be located at Westhampton Beach, Suffolk county, New York and this
 new charter shall take the place in all respects of the provisional charter under which the in-
 stitution has been operating
